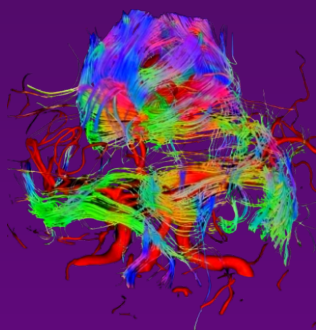

Our Croatian Society of Neuroradiology of the Croatian Medical Association, founded in 2017 in Zagreb, is a member of the European Neuroradiological Society (ESNR) and a member of the World Federation of Neuroradiological Societies (WFNRS). Its focus is on acquiring new neuroradiological knowledge by following the theoretical and practical achievements of the world's most eminent neuroradiologists.

Therefore, we are particularly pleased to announce our 2nd Croatian Neuroradiological Congress with international participation, which will be held in Zagreb on April 4th and 5th, 2025. The Congress will be hybrid/on-line, with the active participation of eminent world and domestic neuroradiologists, from as many as 17 countries. Experts from Switzerland, Sweden, Belgium, Italy, Poland, Hungary, Turkey, Slovenia, USA, Australia, Brazil and South Africa will present their experiences, as well as the latest findings and achievements in neuroradiology. For the Croatian Society of Neuroradiology, as a highly profiled professional society, the lifelong education is of crucial importance for maintaining the high-quality of healthcare, especially for the public healthcare, which ensures the care for the largest number of patients.

At the end of the congress, two university textbooks will be presented: *Dentalna radiologija* in Croatian by Zdravec et al. and *Dental Radiology* in English by Krolo, Zdravec et al. published by *Medicinska naklada*, which are unique in their exceptionally rich collection of pictorial material (more than 350 images) and comprehensive content, divided into 20 chapters. The textbooks are intended for physicians, dentists and for students of dentistry and medicine. „It is the task and obligation of every Croatian intellectual, scientist and teacher to convey their knowledge, in a written form, as a permanent value to the Croatian people, for the overall benefit and prosperity of our homeland Croatia.“ These are the words of the first Croatian president, the late Dr. Franjo Tuđman, which inspired the making of these books.

We are very pleased and proud to be organizing and participating in the 2nd Croatian Neuroradiology Congress with international participation, which is organized under the auspices of the Ministry of Health. We hope it will be a successful and a high-quality contribution to Croatian neuroradiology.
